Election of 2010: Election of NASSH officers for 2011 will take place this fall, and those elected will take their positions following the conference at the University of Texas next spring. Position to be voted on are the President-Elect, Secretary-Treasurer, four members of Council, two members of the Publications Board, and two members of the Distinguished Lectures and Honors Committee. Ballots will be mailed out in the next several weeks.

JSH E-Journal: The *Journal of Sport History* had its first issue in electronic form published as the Spring issue for 2010 as part of our contract with Project MUSE, a non-profit organization that provides 100% full-text electronic journal service for over 400 non-profit publishers, such as NASSH. Project MUSE provides services for non-profit journals in the social sciences and history through subscriptions from institutions such as university libraries. Other non-profit journal publishers such as NASSH include the publications *American Quarterly*, *Canadian Historical Review*, *Journal of Social History*, *Journal of Women's History*, *Nine*, and *Reviews in American History*.

JSH Dedicated Website: A dedicated website for the Journal of Sport History was created in the spring of 2010. It will be operated and updated by the JSH editorial staff. It can be accessed through: www.journalofsporthistory.org. This site is in addition to the NASSH website: www.nassh.org.

JSH Back Issues: Some NASSH members have taken the opportunity to get back issues of the *Journal of Sport History* by paying \$1.00 per issue and the shipping costs. Book Award Winners: The 2010 NASSH Book Awards winners for the best 2009 monograph and anthology were announced at the Orlando conference. **Robert Edelman** won for the best monograph: *Spartak Moscow: A History of the People's Team in the Workers' State* and published by Cornell University Press. The anthology judged best was edited by **Mike Cronin**, **William Murphy**, and **Paul Rouse**, *The Gaelic Athletic Association, 1884-2009: A People's History*, by the Irish Academic Press.

NASSH Honor Awards: At the annual banquet and awards celebration at the close of the Orlando Conference, the NASSH Recognition Award was presented to **Allen Guttmann** for his outstanding leadership in sport history, the publication of important books, service on numerous editorial boards, teaching, writing, and general service to the profession.

Distinguished Lectures Given: Two Distinguished Lectures were presented at the 2010 conference in Orlando. **Mark Dyreson** of Penn State University gave the John R. Betts Address on "A Brief History of the Miniature Golf Craze and American foreign Policy, Or, It's a Small World After All: An Homage to John R. Betts." **David Wiggins** of George Mason University presented the Seward Staley address: "'With All Deliberate Speed': High School Sport, Race, and Brown v. Board of Education."

Graduate Student Essay Address: The winner of the Graduate Student Essay contest was **John Gleaves** of Penn State University. His presentation was titled: “Doping Professionals and Clean Amateurs: Amateurism’s Influences on the Modern Philosophy of Anti-Doping.”

Electronic Conference Abstracts: In the future, NASSH conference abstracts will be submitted electronically and will be placed on the NASSH website prior to the conference. At the 2010 conference there were 117 papers accepted with about 170 individuals registered in Orlando. Forty one of the presenters were students.

Canadian Journal Online: The *Canadian Journal of History of Sport and Physical Education* (presently *Sport History Review*, 1996-2010), founded by **Alan Metcalfe** of the University of Windsor and originally edited and published by Alan and **Heather Metcalfe**, is being made available online from its origin in 1970. The *Canadian Journal* was the first journal dedicated to the history of sport, preceding the *Journal of Sport History* by four years and the North American Society for Sport History by two years. Human Kinetics publisher and **Don Morrow**, present editor of *Sport History Review* made the announcement in September of 2010.

Olympic Symposium: The 10th International Symposium for Olympic Research will be held at the University of Western Ontario, October 28-30, 2010. The Earle Zeigler Address will be given by **Larry Gerlach**, “After the Games Are Gone: Legacies of the 2002 Olympics.” A number of other NASSH members will be making presentations.

ISHPES Congress: The International Society for Physical Education and Sport (ISHPES) will hold its Congress, August 8-12, 2011 in Frankfurt, Germany. Frankfurt is the home of the German Gymnastic Federation, and the Congress will celebrate the 200th anniversary of the German Turner Movement.
